West Coast Baptist College El Salvador is continuing strong here in Cojutepeque. We had our third graduation on May 15. We saw nine graduate with their one-year Bible certificate, seven with their two-year, and three with their three-year certificates. We had a record number of students for the May class with 51 in attendance and several students coming from Honduras. With



the counsel and guidance of WCBC and technicalities on their end, we are going to be changing the name to *Emmanuel Baptist Theological Seminary*. Nothing is changing but the name, and we are excited to be working on the paper work to make the seminary a recognized entity here in El Salvador for the furtherance of the Gospel with preachers, teachers, missionaries, and strong Christians going forth.



We praise the Lord for a harvest of souls during the last two months. There are times to plant, times to water, and at other times, God just brings in the harvest in abundance.

We had two young men in high school accept Christ as Saviour - Lázaro during discipleship with Walter, one of our faithful men; and Jacobo this past Monday during a visit with my wife and me. The joy on their faces and sincerity of their prayers after truly understanding salvation was amazing.



We are in a special series on Wednesday nights right now teaching about dating, marriage, and purity. We had all the children leave for a class with our intern, Leanne, during one of these services. After the class, Ariel (10 years old) came running up to Esther and said, "I need to accept Jesus NOW." The following Sunday Ariel and her parents were baptized as a family.



We have been teaching about salvation since January in our open-enrollment Christian School. As part of our Missions Conference, I had one of our



missionaries give a very clear salvation message during our Monday chapel service. We had soulwinners ready and at the invitation, 33 first through sixth graders received Christ as Saviour one on one with someone who loved, took time, and cared for them. What a joy!! That is what life is all about.

The following Tuesday, three of our ladies went to visit three teenage girls who have begun visiting our church. Right there in their home, all three asked Christ to forgive their sins and be their only Saviour.

I could go on and on about the joy of ministry. We spent time in the nursing homes for our Love Works outreach, had young people in our home on several occasions, had men and ladies' meetings, and prayed for wisdom and God's grace during the trials. The harvest is great, the laborers are few, and we are pleading God to send more laborers to help bring in the great harvest in El Salvador.
